The following and the further and better particulars of the times and places when and where the Acts of Cruelty mentioned in the 3rd 4th and 5th paragraphs of the petition were committed

1. The acts of cruelty mentioned in the said 3rd and 4th paragraphs were committed 4 or 5 times in each week and sometimes daily commencing on the night of your Petitioners Marriage on the 11th February 1869 up to the month of September 1878 when the petitioner was prematurely confined of a five months child and it was during this pregnancy that the acts of cruelty were chiefly and most strongly practised and committed upon the petitioner. The said Acts of cruelty were committed at the Respondents permanent residence The Laund Accrington, Lancashire and at various places in England on the Continent and in America visited by the Respondent and Petitioner from the time of their marriage up to the end of October 1878 when his health which about this time

Was extremely bad compelled him to a certain extent to desist

2. The Act of Cruelty complained of in the 5th Paragraph of the Said petition was committed in the month of June 1879 in a Railway Train and also on the platform of a Railway Station near Venice
3.
